I. INTRODUCTION

1. This document has been prepared in response to Executive Board decision 2002/3, which requested the Executive Director to submit to the Executive Board at its annual session 2003, a report on a monitoring and evaluation system of the Technical Advisory Programme (TAP). At its first regular session 2002, the Board endorsed the proposed option for the TAP that shifted the emphasis of the UNFPA Country Technical Services Teams (CSTs) towards more strategic interventions, a greater focus on capacity-building and knowledge sharing, and increased reliance on national and regional human and institutional resources. This option also transformed the arrangement with United Nations system partners into a more strategic framework, through the strategic partnership programme.

Background

2. The TAP constitutes the organization's strategy to increase the efficiency, effectiveness and impact of its technical support in reproductive health, population and development, and gender. It does this within the context of the Millennium Development Goals (MDGs) and the UNFPA mandate, which is guided by the Programme of Action of the International Conference on Population (ICPD) and its five-year review (ICPD+5) and reflected in the multi-year funding framework. The TAP is also a key element in implementing the Fund's strategic direction.

3. The TAP is composed of nine multidisciplinary CSTs, each supervised by a Director, with the exception of the CST in Suva, Fiji, where the UNFPA Representative serves as CST Director. The composition and technical skills of each CST respond to the specific needs and capacities of the subregions and regions in which they are located. Their primary responsibility is to provide technical support and to develop capacity at the country level. However, the CSTs also provide a field-based regional perspective and undertake knowledge sharing at organizational and regional levels. The nine teams, together with the Technical Support Division at headquarters, constitute the UNFPA technical advisory system, which provides integrated technical support to the UNFPA programming process.

4. The TAP also includes the strategic partnership programme with partners from the United Nations system. This initiative, a results-based partnership developed according to the priorities of each partner organization, focuses on developing outputs that will improve the effectiveness of UNFPA programmes. The strategic partnership programme will be implemented through project agreements with executing agencies. These agreements will be based on clearly defined outputs and strategies, and will be subject to regular monitoring and evaluation. The final evaluation of the TAP will assess the impact of the strategic partnership programme's outputs on the work of the CSTs.

5. The outcomes of the TAP are: (a) increased national and regional capacity to provide technical support for population and development programmes; (b) increased accessibility and use of technical information, including lessons learned, to improve the effectiveness of national population and development programmes; and (c) improved strategic technical support at key stages of the UNFPA programme cycle, in United Nations system-wide processes, such as the common country assessment (CCA) and the United Nations Development Assistance Framework (UNDAF), and in national development frameworks.

6. The aim of the monitoring and evaluation system is to assess the effectiveness of the TAP in providing strategic technical support. The monitoring and evaluation system will assess the contribution

of TAP outputs to achieving the ICPD goals and the MDGs. The process will begin by monitoring technical assistance *activities*. During the second stage, in 2004, the quality of the technical assistance *results* will be assessed. During the third and final stage, the impact of the TAP, namely, its contribution to achieving the *goals and outcomes* of the UNFPA multi-year funding framework, 2004-2007, will be assessed. The proposed monitoring and evaluation tool described in the annex will be reviewed at the internal TAP meeting in 2003, and changes will be incorporated, if necessary.

7. The system will focus on achieving TAP objectives and will not assess the individual performance of CST advisers. The quality of the technical assistance provided by each CST adviser will be assessed in accordance with the UNFPA performance management system.

II. MONITORING AND EVALUATION SYSTEM

Purpose

8. The purpose of the monitoring and evaluation system is to: (a) monitor the shift in emphasis of the TAP to more strategic interventions and to undertake timely, corrective action when necessary; and (b) determine if the new strategic approach is yielding expected results and contributing to the achievement of UNFPA goals and outcomes, as indicated in the multi-year funding framework.

9. The monitoring and evaluation system defines the results expected at different levels from implementing the TAP. The results include those for which the CSTs are mainly accountable, as well as those to which they are expected to contribute at regional and organizational levels (see annex). The assessment of these results will also provide information on the collaboration of CSTs with country offices and headquarters, as well as with United Nations organizations, regional commissions and other institutions. Thus, effective application of the monitoring and evaluation system will identify factors that either facilitate or hinder the achievement of TAP outputs through the examination of a wide spectrum of UNFPA operations.

10. The CSTs are primarily accountable for producing results at the country level, including: (a) increased national expertise to provide technical assistance in reproductive health, population and development, and gender; (b) increased availability of information on conceptual frameworks and methodologies, lessons learned and on evidence-based recommendations for policy dialogue; and (c) strategic technical assistance at the national policy level and at key stages of the UNFPA programme cycle and in United Nations system-wide processes. At regional and organizational levels, the CSTs are expected to contribute to the development of organizational policies, strategies and technical guides.

Functions

11. The monitoring and evaluation system will: (a) provide a standard, practical tool to collect and analyse data to monitor and evaluate the TAP; (b) provide information to systematically assess the TAP as a whole as well as its individual components, which include nine CSTs and the strategic partnership programme; and (c) allow for timely decisions to improve the implementation of the new TAP approach, based on the analysis of data and information.

Process

12. The coordination of the TAP arrangement is essential in ensuring coherence and in effectively delivering outputs. The main function of the CSTs is to provide country offices with high-quality

technical assistance. UNFPA geographical divisions will ensure that the work of the CSTs supports country programmes effectively. The Technical Support Division of UNFPA will ensure that the technical advisory system responds to the goals and priorities of the organization by providing integrated technical support at all programme levels.

13. The UNFPA programme committee, chaired by the Deputy Executive Director (Programme), will oversee the implementation of the TAP. The programme committee oversees the strategic direction of the Fund and promotes results-based management in UNFPA programme strategies and operations. The programme committee will be responsible for overseeing the implementation of the TAP monitoring and evaluation system and for ensuring that technical assistance trends and emerging needs are integrated into organizational priorities and the work of the CSTs.

14. The monitoring and evaluation process has three components: (a) the collection of information by CSTs on technical support activities, using the monitoring and evaluation tool in the annex; (b) an analysis of this information by CSTs and relevant United Nations organizations to identify strengths and weaknesses and make recommendations for corrective action; the analysis will also include the findings of a midterm review that will assess the quality and usefulness of the TAP outputs; and (c) an external and internal evaluation in the third year of implementation of the TAP, to assess its contribution to the goals and outcomes of the UNFPA multi-year funding framework.

15. Using the monitoring and evaluation tool, the CSTs in each region or subregion will establish mechanisms to collect information about the technical activities they undertake. This will enable UNFPA to assess the annual performance of each CST and the TAP system as a whole.

16. At the annual TAP meeting, chaired by the Deputy Executive Director (Programme), the CST Directors will present an analysis of the technical assistance provided by each CST. The assessment will be based on information collected on each of the CST functions, but will not preclude the presentation of other relevant information. In addition to the CST Directors, participants will include staff from all geographical divisions, the Technical Support Division, the Strategic Planning Unit, the Division for Oversight Services as well as selected UNFPA Representatives from each region.

17. The expected results of the annual review are: (a) an assessment of the performance of each CST as compared to its output-based work plan; (b) a general assessment of the performance of all CSTs; (c) identification of common facilitating and constraining factors, as well as lessons learned, related to the implementation and the management of the new strategic approach of the TAP; (d) an assessment of the effectiveness of the TAP integration into and collaboration with headquarters units; and (e) an assessment of the usefulness of specific outputs agreed upon with United Nations organizations and regional economic commissions.

Assessment

18. There will be both an internal and external assessment of the TAP. UNFPA will conduct the following exercises:

(a) A review in 2004 of the quality, relevance and usefulness of TAP results. This will be part of the TAP midterm review, the results of which will be submitted to the Executive Board at its second regular session 2004;

(b) An independent, in-depth evaluation in 2005. External consultants will conduct the evaluation, which will include inputs from governments, country offices, regional and global partners, UNFPA headquarters, CST Directors and CST advisers. The evaluation findings will be part of the analysis undertaken at the final TAP meeting in 2005;

(c) A final TAP meeting in 2005. The meeting will discuss the overall achievements of the TAP during the period 2002-2005. At this meeting, CST Directors and representatives from United Nations partner agencies and organizations will analyse their contributions to the TAP outputs. The aggregated analysis will determine how the TAP results were able to contribute to the achievement of UNFPA goals and outcomes, as stated in the multi-year funding framework, 2004-2007. The final assessment will provide the basis for developing future strategic directions for the TAP.

III. ANNEX: MONITORING AND EVALUATION TOOL

The CSTs will collect information using this monitoring and evaluation tool, which describes the *outcomes* to which CSTs are expected to contribute; the *outputs* to be achieved under each outcome; and the *activities* required to achieve each output, with respective indicators and means of verification.
