United Nations Capital Development Fund

Item 7 United Nations Office for Project Services

The year 2003 was transitional for UNOPS with the new Executive Director assuming his functions on 1 August 2003. Furthermore, UNOPS recorded income exceeding recurring and non-recurring administrative expenditures, thereby adhering to the self-financing principle of the organization. The organization invested in the new Enterprise Resource Planning system, ATLAS, and embarked on an overall change management process.

Pursuant to Executive Board decision 2004/3, the Executive Director reports on the updated 2004-2005 budget estimates and on consultations concerning the vision, mandate and governance of UNOPS.
