**Extensions of country programmes**

**Note by the Executive Director**

*Summary*

The present note contains information on the first extension of the fourth country programme for Zimbabwe. The Government of Zimbabwe requested the extension.

With this request for extension, UNFPA seeks to harmonize its process for extending country programmes with that of UNDP. In accordance with the established procedures of that process, the Executive Director approves the first one-year extension of a country programme, while requests for extensions for a second year or two-year extensions are submitted to the Executive Board for approval.

The Executive Board may wish to approve the two-year extension of the country programme for Zimbabwe, as indicated in the attached table.
