Item 1 Organizational matters

In accordance with rule 7 of the Rules of Procedure of the Executive Board of UNDP and UNFPA, the Board will elect a new Bureau consisting of a President and four Vice-Presidents. According to the established pattern of rotation of posts among the various regional groups, the President of the Executive Board for 2004 should be elected from the Board members of the Asian and Pacific States group.

Under this item, the Executive Board will adopt the agenda and agree on the work plan for the session as presented by the Secretary of the Board. The Board will also approve the report on its second regular session 2003. A draft report was distributed to members of the Board for their comments; the final report contains comments received.

Item 3

Multi-year funding framework

In response to Executive Board decision 2003/24, UNDP is submitting a proposal outlining an approach to report on the multi-year funding framework (MYFF), 2004-2007. The proposed approach should facilitate the measurement, collection and analysis of information on results, allowing the MYFF to become the main UNDP policy document and serve as the principal strategic resource and management tool. It will allow the organization to translate the goals and service lines set out in the MYFF into strategic guidance for country-level programming, thereby promoting programmatic focus further. The document will also describe how best to monitor and assess the implementation of organizational strategies. How UNDP intends to make distinctive contributions to development effectiveness will receive close attention. The document also introduces an approach for assessing internal performance and fostering strategic partnerships within the United Nations and beyond.

Item 4

UNIFEM

The UNIFEM multi-year funding framework, 2004-2007, provides strategic and management direction for UNIFEM to increase development effectiveness, strengthen partnerships and mobilize resources for the next four years. It highlights the importance of the UNIFEM role in the United Nations system as catalyst and innovator, promoting gender equality in line with national priorities and regional and global commitments. The MYFF introduces the strategic results framework, highlighting key goals to which all UNIFEM programmes will contribute, and the integrated resources framework, which seeks to achieve multi-year funding commitments to support the UNIFEM mandate.

UNIFEM looks forward to guidance and endorsement from the Executive Board in response to the strategic directions and priorities set out in the MYFF, 2004-2007, as well as to its willingness to recommend that full support is made available to cover the revenue needed to carry out this plan.

Item 5

Country programmes and related matters

The report on assistance to Myanmar contains the major conclusions, recommendations and strategic challenges identified by the independent assessment mission of the Human Development Initiative phase IV (2002-2004). This annual assessment is carried out in accordance with the mandate governing UNDP assistance to Myanmar, namely Governing Council decision 93/21 and Executive Board decisions 96/1, 98/14, 2001/15 and 2003/2. The Executive Board may wish to adopt a decision, the elements of which are contained in the report.

Under this item, the Executive Board will also be asked to: (a) take note of the one-year extensions of the second country cooperation frameworks (CCF) for the Democratic People's Republic of Korea and the Republic of Korea and of the first extension of the first subregional cooperation framework for the countries of the Organisation of Eastern Caribbean States and Barbados, approved by the Administrator; (b) approve a two-year extension of the second CCF for Guyana; and (c) approve a one-year extension of the second cooperation framework for technical cooperation among developing countries.

As requested by the Executive Board in its decision 2001/11, the following country programmes will be approved on a no-objection basis without presentation or discussion:

Africa region: Benin, the Central African Republic, Kenya, Niger, the Republic of the Congo and Sierra Leone;

Arab States region: Djibouti;

Asia and the Pacific region: Pakistan and Thailand;

Europe and the Commonwealth of Independent States region: Croatia, Lithuania, Poland and the Russian Federation;

Latin America and the Caribbean region: Ecuador.

Item 10

Country programmes and related matters

Under this item, the Executive Board will have before it the intercountry programme, 2004-2007, which is designed to strengthen the capacity of countries to implement the Programme of Action of the International Conference on Population

and Development (ICPD) and the key actions of ICPD+5 and achieve the Millennium Development Goals. The proposed intercountry programme is consistent with the goals and outcomes of the UNFPA multi-year funding framework. The intercountry programme builds on lessons learned from the previous intercountry programme, 2000-2003, a review of which is also before the Executive Board.

The Executive Board may wish to approve the proposed UNFPA intercountry programme, 2004-2007, as contained in the report, in the amount of \$226 million. The Board may also wish to take note of the review of the UNFPA intercountry programme, 2000-2003.

As requested by the Executive Board in its decision 2001/11, the following country programmes will be approved on a no-objection basis without presentation or discussion, unless at least five members have informed the secretariat in writing before the meeting of their wish to bring a particular country programme before the Executive Board: Benin, the Republic of the Congo, Kenya, Lesotho, Niger, Sierra Leone, Afghanistan, Pakistan, Cuba and Ecuador.

Item 11

Multi-year funding framework

Under this item, the Executive Board will have before it the UNFPA multi-year funding framework, 2004-2007. The MYFF is the Fund's medium-term strategic plan and aims to strengthen the Fund's contribution to the implementation of the ICPD Programme of Action and the achievement of the MDGs. The MYFF comprises a strategic results framework and an integrated resources framework. The strategic results framework outlines the MYFF development goals, outcomes, indicators and strategies, and provides a rationale for their selection. The integrated resources framework sets out resource requirements for the MYFF period, 2004-2007. The report also outlines UNFPA plans to increase and monitor organizational effectiveness.

The Executive Board may wish, inter alia, to take note of the report, endorse the MYFF, 2004-2007, approve the integrated resources framework for 2004-2007, as contained in the report, and encourage all countries to assist UNFPA to reach a total resource figure of \$1 523 million for the period 2004-2007.

Review of the WHO/UNICEF/UNFPA Coordinating Committee on Health

At its third session (19-20 April 2001, New York), the WHO/UNICEF/UNFPA Coordinating Committee on Health (CCH) requested the CCH secretariat to conduct a joint review of the CCH terms of reference, roles, functions and methods of work in order to assess its relevance, value and effectiveness. Based on the findings of the review, it is recommended to the Executive Boards of the three organizations that the CCH be discontinued and that the secretariats of the three organizations continue to strengthen their coordination.

The Executive Board may wish to endorse the discontinuation of the WHO/UNICEF/UNFPA Coordinating Committee on Health.
