Item 1 Organizational matters

In accordance with decision 96/25, a draft work plan for 2005 is being submitted to the Executive Board. The document will be finalized by the secretariat in close consultation with the Bureau of the Board and will be submitted to the Executive Board at its first regular session 2005 for adoption.

Item 2 Financial, budgetary and administrative matters

The report on the annual review of the financial situation, building on the financial information provided to the Executive Board throughout the year, undertakes a comprehensive review and analysis from the financial perspective of UNDP activities at the global and aggregate levels. The overview assesses the organization's performance against the various sources for programming: regular resources, other resources and UNDP-administered funds.

The Executive Board may wish to take note of the above report and adopt a decision, elements of which are contained in the report.

In accordance with Governing Council decision 81/34, the Administrator is required to present on an annual basis a report on technical cooperation information of the entire United Nations system. Its purpose is to examine regular and extrabudgetary expenditure financed from sources other than UNDP, UNFPA, UNICEF and WFP, contributions received to finance technical cooperation activities, as well as individually examine expenditures/contributions data reported by the four

organizations. New to this year's report is the reemergence of contributions by the World Bank Group to the field of technical cooperation.

The Executive Board may wish to take note of the above report.

The report on UNDP strategic cost management and implications for cost recovery provides a framework for strategic cost management, and provides an update on UNDP cost recovery policy, as originally presented to the Executive Board at its second regular session 2003 (DP/2003/28). The ultimate objective of UNDP is the true attribution of all programme and management cost to their proper fund source, as well as the linkage to the relevant MYFF goal, which is also a prerequisite for results-based budgeting. This approach, combined with continuous monitoring of cost recovery income, will ensure that there is no undue cross-subsidization among various fund sources.

The Executive Board may wish to adopt a decision, elements of which are contained in the report.

The biennial report of the Inter-Agency Procurement Services Office (IAPSO) is submitted pursuant to Executive Board decision 96/2 and provides an update on IAPSO activities from June 2002 to June 2004. During the biennium, IAPSO has strengthened its consulting and capacity-building work, diversified its revenue sources and consolidated the restructuring of its operations, ensuring its continuing self-financing status.

Item 3

South-South cooperation

As requested in its decision 2003/10, the Executive Board will have before it the third cooperation framework for South-South cooperation (2005-2007). The document lays out a strategy for jumpstarting a dynamic new phase of South-South cooperation driven by a convergence of human and technological breakthroughs in the developing world. The framework also elaborates on the catalytic initiatives that the Special Unit for South-South Cooperation aims to implement in collaboration with a broad range of partners in the development community.

The Board may wish to approve the third cooperation framework for South-South cooperation.

Item 4

Evaluation

This year's annual report of the Administrator on evaluation examines the progress made by UNDP in contributing to global and national development results as validated by independent assessment. Expanding on earlier reports, the report highlights findings and key lessons derived from strategic evaluations conducted by UNDP and its associated funds and programmes. It also provides future directions for evaluation to strengthen the culture of assessment and the use of evaluative evidence for decision-making.

The evaluation of the second global cooperation framework (GCF-II) was undertaken to assess the effectiveness of the overall approach of GCF-II and the outcomes achieved. The evaluation sought to: (a) assess the overall performance and degree to which the intended organizational goals and development results have been achieved; (b) ascertain how the GCF-II has contributed strategically to positioning UNDP as a major upstream policy advisor for poverty reduction and sustainable human development and as a knowledge-based organization; and (c) develop recommendations for the design of the third phase of the GCF. The executive summary presents the key findings of the independent evaluation and recommendations on the strategic focus, management and modalities that the third GCF may adopt.

The Board will also have before it the official response by the Administrator to the findings and recommendations of the evaluation of the second global cooperation framework. The management response provides some clarifications regarding the outcomes of GCF-II and describes the actions being taken to strengthen further the management of the global programme and to ensure the successful preparation and implementation of GCF-III.

The Executive Board may wish to express its support for these management actions.

Item 5

Country programmes and related matters

In accordance with Governing Council decision 93/4 and Executive Board decision 99/7, the Board will have before it the note on assistance to Somalia, submitted at the initiative of the Administrator, outlining the proposed UNDP programme for 2005-2006. In light of the situation in the country and past and ongoing activities, the note has been formulated taking into account recent developments in the peace and reconciliation process.

The Administrator seeks the approval of the Executive Board to continue to approve projects on a case-by-case basis.

Under this item, the Executive Board will also be asked to: (a) approve two-year extensions for the second country cooperation framework for Senegal, Saint Helena and Paraguay; and (b) comment on the draft country programme documents for Mauritius, the Democratic People's Republic of Korea, the Republic of Korea and Guatemala prior to the finalization of the country programmes.

An oral report on UNDP assistance to Myanmar will be presented to the Executive Board. The report will cover major findings and conclusions of the 2004 independent assessment of the Human Development Initiative projects conducted in August 2004 in accordance with the guidelines set out in Governing Council decision 93/21 and Executive Board decisions 96/1, 98/14, 2001/15, 2003/2 and 2004/2. The full report will be submitted to the Board at its first regular session 2005 with the accompanying note by the Administrator.
