Item 2 Annual report of the Executive Director

Under this item the Executive Board will have before it the annual report of the Executive Director for 2005.

Part I of the report presents highlights of the UNFPA programme during 2005. Beginning with a focus on responding to the new development aid environment, the report highlights the work of the Fund in the areas of reproductive health, population and development and gender. The report also includes a focus on investing in organizational effectiveness.

Part I, Add.1 presents statistical highlights concerning the finances and programmes of the Fund in 2005.

The Executive Board may wish to adopt a decision on the annual report 2005 of the Executive Director.

Pursuant to General Assembly resolution 59/267, paragraph 27, the Executive Board will have before it a report jointly prepared by UNFPA and UNDP on the reports of the Joint Inspection Unit (JIU). The report (Part II of the annual report of the Executive Director for 2005) provides a synopsis of management comments on the recommendations of the JIU. Of the nine reports issued by JIU in 2005, four have cross-agency impacts, and the management responses are discussed in the report submitted to the Executive Board. In line with the desire of the Executive Board and the current United Nations emphasis on simplifications and harmonization, the present report has been prepared jointly by UNDP and UNFPA.

Annual report of the Administrator

The multi-year funding framework (MYFF) 2004-2007 (document DP/2003/32) was approved by the Executive Board at the second regular session 2003 in its decision 2003/24, establishing the organizational goals and intended results for the four-year period. The MYFF goals and results are derived principally from the demand for UNDP assistance from programme countries. The goals are also informed by a range of other corporate and international goals and concerns, such as the MDGs, United Nations reform priorities, and the specific mandates of UNDP. The present document reports on UNDP performance against these core goals and organizational strategies for 2005. The observations made in the report are derived from the performance analysis of 135 country programmes, reporting results achieved against planned annual targets towards intended outcomes. In line with Executive Board requirements, the report contains performance information on programme focus and results, organizational strategies and expenditures, to achieve the objectives of the MYFF. As requested by the Board in its decision 2005/20, the report adopts 'capacity development' as its main theme, which is integrated throughout the analysis.

Pursuant to General Assembly resolution 59/267, para 27, the Executive Board will also have before it the report of the Joint Inspection Unit (JIU). The report provides a synopsis of management comments on the recommendations of the JIU. Of the nine reports issued by JIU in 2005, four have cross-agency impacts, and the management responses are discussed in this paper. In line with the desire of the Executive Board and the current United Nations emphasis on simplifications and harmonization, the present report has been prepared jointly by UNDP and UNFPA.

Item 14 United Nations Development Fund for Women

Under this agenda item, the Board will have before it a report on implementation of the UNIFEM multi-year funding framework (MYFF), 2004-2007, as endorsed in Executive Board decision 2004/10 and in line with decision 2005/22. The report tracks progress made during the second year of implementation of the MYFF according to the goals and outcomes in the strategic results framework and the organizational effectiveness matrix and in alignment with the projected integrated resources framework.

The Executive Board may wish to take note of the report and adopt a decision, elements of which are contained in the report. The Board may also wish to encourage UNIFEM to continue to track progress on its MYFF according to the goals, outcomes and indicators in its results frameworks; and may wish to encourage all countries in a position to do so to assist UNIFEM in reaching the targeted level of regular resources, including through multi-year pledges.

The *Organizational Assessment: UNIFEM Past, Present and Future* (report of the Advisory Panel to the UNIFEM Consultative Committee) (A/60/62 – E/2005/10) was presented at the first regular session 2006. Taking note of the report, which was commissioned by the UNIFEM Consultative Committee, the Board, in its decision 2006/5, “requested the Administrator to report to the Executive Board his views on the ‘Organizational assessment: UNIFEM past, present and future’, taking into account ongoing discussion on United Nations reform and the overall gender architecture”. The present report responds to the findings and recommendations contained in the organizational assessment. The Executive Board may wish to endorse the Administrator’s report.

Item 15 Evaluation

The annual report of the Administrator on evaluation, drawing from the 305 evaluations conducted in 2005, provides an overview of the performance of the evaluation function in UNDP and its associated funds and programmes during the year. It provides a trend analysis of evaluation as compared to the last reporting period. In addition, the report outlines the contribution made by the organization to development results, and highlights a number of key organizational lessons. The Executive Board may wish to adopt a decision on the findings of the report.

In its review of the annual report of the Administrator on evaluation 2004, the Board endorsed the codification of an evaluation policy for UNDP during the 2005

reporting period. The policy establishes a common institutional framework for the evaluation function and in so doing seeks to enhance transparency, efficiency and coherence in the execution of the evaluation function. It defines the guiding principles and norms for evaluation, the most significant of which are the independence of the function and the use of approaches guided by the goals of human development, national ownership, and United Nations reform. The policy outlines the governance structure, the roles and responsibilities, the purpose and nature of the types of evaluations, the requisite coverage for corporate oversight, and the use of evaluation. It also presents the resource, capacity and partnership requirements for an effective evaluation function. The policy provides the broad parameters of the evaluation function; operational procedures will be developed as a follow-up to the policy.

The Board may wish to endorse the evaluation policy and adopt a decision.

In late 2004, the Evaluation Office undertook a strategic evaluation of the role and contributions of UNDP in the HIV and AIDS response in Southern Africa and Ethiopia covering the period 1999-2004. Country assessments were conducted in 10 countries: Angola, Botswana, Ethiopia, Lesotho, Malawi, Namibia, South Africa, Swaziland, Zambia, and Zimbabwe. The relevance, effectiveness and sustainability of UNDP HIV and AIDS responses were the core issues for the evaluation. It assessed the outcomes of UNDP strategy, programmes and projects at the country level and its achievements – whether UNDP was targeting the right things and whether it was going in the right direction. The scope covered five thematic areas in relation to HIV and AIDS: governance, leadership, mainstreaming, capacity development and partnerships for country results. The executive summary presents the key findings and recommendations of the evaluation.

The Executive Board will also have before it the UNDP management response to the findings and recommendations of the evaluation.

Multi-year funding framework, 2008-2011

In response to Executive Board decision 2006/1, the present document outlines for discussion the emerging strategic vision of the Administrator. The document is meant to accompany the multi-year funding framework report on UNDP performance and results, 2005 (document DP/2006/17). Consistent with decision 2006/1, the document responds to some of the issues raised in the 2005 MYFF report on

UNDP performance and results. It also highlights key and complementary initiatives launched in 2005 that are not featured in the MYFF report, but which inform the Administrator's emerging strategic vision. The document takes into consideration the World Summit outcome of September 2005 and anticipates the challenges that UNDP must confront following the outcome of the Secretary-General's High-level Panel on United Nations System-wide Coherence in the Areas of Development, Humanitarian Assistance, and the Environment. The document also takes into account the lessons from the ongoing UNDP review of its results management system and the changing development landscape, which will inform the multi-year funding framework, 2008-2011, that will be presented to the Board for final approval in 2007.

Item 16 Internal audit and oversight

The Executive Board will have before it the internal audit and oversight reports of UNDP, UNFPA and UNOPS.

The UNDP report is submitted pursuant to arrangements agreed on by the Executive Board. It provides details of internal audit and oversight services provided by the UNDP Office of Audit and Performance Review (OAPR) for the year ended 31 December 2005. The report is prepared in compliance with Executive Board decisions 2004/39 and 2005/19. The report contains the management response to significant issues raised in internal audit reports. The Executive Board may wish to take note of the report and express support for the continued strengthening of UNDP internal audit and investigation services and its request for additional resources, and may also wish to recognize the initiatives of OAPR in promoting a risk-management culture in UNDP.

The UNFPA report presents a summary of the internal audit and oversight activities of UNFPA in 2005. As requested by the Executive Board, the report presents a new structure to allow a prospective analysis of the 'risk universe' of UNFPA and a better understanding of the trends. The Executive Board may wish to take note of the report and comment on the reporting format.

The UNOPS report presents information on the activities relating to internal audit, management advisory and investigation services provided by OAPR for the year ended 31 December 2005. The report is prepared in compliance with Executive Board decisions 2004/39 and 2005/19. The report contains the management responses to the 2005 reports indicating the strategy, timeline and indicators of progress or completion, and provides an analysis and presentation of

the follow-up on previous internal audit recommendations in the audit reports of 2004. The Executive Board may wish to take note of the report.

Item 17 Programming process

Under this item the Executive Board will have before it two reports.

The report on the implementation experience of joint programming and joint programmes has been prepared in response to UNDP/UNFPA Executive Board decision 2005/10 and United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF) Executive Board decision 2005/3. The report comprises a common main text for all three organizations and organization-specific annexes. The report states that UNDP, UNFPA and UNICEF are committed to joint programming and joint programmes and that this collaboration has been facilitated by the introduction of the common country programming process and the issuance of the inter-organization Guidance Note on Joint Programming. The instruments set out in the Guidance Note ensure that, while participating in joint programmes, the organizations retain a focus on their respective mandates and that standards of financial accountability and reporting are maintained. The report includes positive lessons as well as operational and programmatic constraints to joint programmes. The programmatic limitations are currently being addressed in the proposed United Nations common country programming reforms; operational issues identified also require United Nations system-wide measures.

The Board may wish to take note of the progress made to date and seek a further progress report and an evaluation of implementation of joint programmes at a suitable time.

In response to decision 2005/28, the Administrator of UNDP and the Executive Director of UNFPA present a report elaborated jointly with UNICEF on possible options to further improve the current harmonized country programme approval process. The report presents options on improving the country programme preparation, format and approval process.

The Executive Board may wish to adopt a decision on this report.
