UNFPA IN 2005:
PROGRAMME AND FINANCIAL HIGHLIGHTS¹

Pledges and contributions

- Regular income in 2005 totalled \$365.8 million, an increase of 11.6 per cent compared to the 2004 income of \$327.7 million. This includes \$351.2 million in voluntary contributions, \$6.3 million in interest income, and other income of \$8.3 million.
- Pledges to UNFPA regular resources in 2005 totalled \$351.2 million from donor Governments and a private contribution from the Mars Trust. This is \$28.7 million, or 8.9 per cent, more than the \$322.5 million pledged in 2004. At year's end, cumulative pledges through 2005 totalled about \$6.1 billion from a cumulative total of 191 donors. The number of donor Governments in 2005 totalled 172. As mentioned above, there was also a contribution from the Mars Trust.
- Contributions to other resources of \$193.7 million were provided through co-financing arrangements, which include trust funds and cost-sharing (\$157.6 million) and other arrangements (\$36.1 million). The contribution of \$193.7 million is an increase of approximately 13.0 per cent compared to \$171.4 million in 2004. Interest and other income of \$5.5 million bring to \$199.2 million the total income for other resources for 2005.
- Total regular and other resources income in 2005 was \$565.0 million.

Expenditures

- Programme expenditures for regular resources in 2005 totalled \$234.3 million, as compared to \$221.9 million in 2004. The 2005 figure includes \$186.7 million for country programmes, compared to \$181.6 million in 2004; and \$47.6 million for intercountry and interregional activities, compared to \$40.3 million in 2004.
- Technical support services under the successor support cost arrangements approved by the Governing Council in decision 91/37 were \$18.9 million.
- For regular resource expenditures in 2005 by programme areas, by geographical area, and by country category, see data on pages 5-12. In decision 2004/7, the Executive Board approved the multi-year funding framework (MYFF) 2004–2007, which focuses on the three results areas of reproductive health, population and development, and gender as key requirements for poverty eradication.

Country categories

- Executive Board decision 96/15 endorsed the procedure for allocating resources according to categorization of countries into groups, and decisions 2000/19 and 2005/13 updated the relative shares of resources to groups as follows:

- In decision 2005/13, the Executive Board endorsed the procedure for categorizing countries into Groups A, B and C as outlined in the report DP/FPA/2005/6 and approved the relative share of resources presented in table 4 of the aforementioned report. In accordance with decision 2005/13, countries with economies in transition have been mainstreamed into A, B, C and O groups, based on their individual levels of achievement with respect to the resource allocation system indicators. (For a list of countries by group, see page 13.)
- The breakdown of resources expended for country programmes and projects in 2005, by group, is as follows: Group A, 67.5 per cent; Group B, 23.0 per cent; Group C, 9.1 per cent; and other countries and territories, 0.4 per cent.
- Total expenditures in 2005 for Group A countries amounted to \$126.1 million, compared to \$121.1 million in 2004. In 2005, \$84.8 million was spent on least developed countries and \$129.8 million was spent on low income economies. This represents 45.4 per cent and 69.5 per cent of total regular resource country programme expenditures, respectively. In 2004, the amounts spent on least developed countries and low income economies were \$86.4 million and \$125.8 million, respectively.

Intercountry and interregional activities

- Expenditures for intercountry and interregional activities totalled \$47.6 million in 2005, compared to \$40.3 million in 2004. By category of activity, these expenditures were: regional, \$16.6 million in 2005, compared to \$12.2 million in 2004; intercountry and interregional, \$31.0 million in 2005, compared to \$28.1 million in 2004.
- Intercountry and interregional activities accounted for 20.3 per cent of total programme expenditures in 2005, compared to 18.2 per cent in 2004.

Biennial support budget

- The net expenditure for the biennial support budget for 2005 was approximately \$78.6 million, representing 21.5 per cent of regular resources and 13.9 per cent of total resources income.

Personnel

- As of 1 January 2005, the total number of authorized budget posts numbered 972, comprising 439 Professional (including 225 national programme officers) and 533 General Service staff. These include 113 Professional and 108 General Service posts at headquarters, 2 Professional and 1 General Service posts in Geneva and 324 Professional and 424 local General Service posts in the field.

- The percentage of women among UNFPA Professional staff at headquarters and in the field was 45 percent in 2005, one of the highest percentages among United Nations agencies and organizations. Moreover, 6 of the 14 members of the Fund's Executive Committee are women.
