**FUNDING COMMITMENTS TO UNFPA:
REPORT ON CONTRIBUTIONS BY MEMBER STATES TO
REGULAR RESOURCES AND CO-FINANCING ARRANGEMENTS
FOR 2007 AND FUTURE YEARS***

Report of the Executive Director

Introduction

1. This report is prepared in response to Executive Board decisions 99/5 and 2000/9, which requested the Executive Director to provide annually updated estimates of regular resources and other resources from co-financing arrangements in the multi-year funding framework (MYFF). Since the introduction of the MYFF in 2000, UNFPA has been actively campaigning for, and receiving, multi-year pledges. The purpose of the present report is to promote dialogue between UNFPA and its Executive Board on the Fund's overall resource situation while continuing to address the common and important goal of increasing regular resources and achieving a stable and predictable resource base.

2. The 2005 World Summit reaffirmed that individuals and couples must have universal access to reproductive health by 2015. The inclusion of the target of universal access to reproductive health by 2015 in the Millennium Development Goals (MDGs) framework creates an opportunity for countries to better monitor the implementation of the Programme of Action of the International Conference on Population and Development (ICPD) and the MDGs. UNFPA is committed to supporting national efforts to integrate the target into national development strategies, budgets and plans.

3. In the new aid architecture, the UNFPA mandate on population and development, reproductive health, including sexual health and family planning, and gender is more relevant than ever and deserves full support. Thus, it is imperative that the Fund's regular income continues to grow. Increased resources

would enable UNFPA to expand its programmes to help countries attain the goals of ICPD and the Millennium Declaration. The MDGs and reproductive health are inextricably linked. By increasing their contributions to UNFPA, Member States will enhance the Fund's ability to assist countries in addressing reproductive health issues, such as HIV/AIDS and maternal mortality, and, thereby, in fulfilling the commitment made at the 2005 World Summit.

A. Income overview

4. The present report contains tables and charts on UNFPA regular resources and co-financing arrangements. Additional data are provided in the annexes. The donor income figures are inclusive of exchange gains and losses. To meet the schedule for submission of the report to the Executive Board for the 2007 annual session, the data presented for 2007 in this document are based on information received and pledges recorded as of 1 March 2007. The 2006 figures are provisional.

5. In 2006, UNFPA attained the highest income ever of total resources (regular and co-financing), reaching about \$556.5 million (table 1). The total income for UNFPA in 2006 was \$389.3 million in regular resources and \$167.2 million for co-financing resources. Compared with 2005, the increase in income for regular resources in 2006 was \$23.5 million, or 6.4 per cent. The increase in income for co-financing arrangements was \$9.5 million or 6.0 per cent. This represents an encouraging growth in contributions by donor and programme countries alike.

6. In December 2006, UNFPA signed a tripartite agreement with Americans for UNFPA (a non-governmental organization) and a private donor for the transfer of most assets of a private endowment trust to UNFPA. As a result, through Americans for UNFPA, UNFPA received \$15.4 million in 2006 and \$17.3 million in 2007 to its regular resources. However, based on the request of the donor, only the interest of the trust will be used.

7. As of 1 March 2007, the projected regular contribution for 2007 was \$408.9 million. Of this amount, approximately \$391.6 million was from donor governments, and \$17.3 million was from the above-mentioned private donation of a private endowment trust to UNFPA. The projected increase in

2007 was \$19.6 million over the 2006 level at the current exchange rate. Towards that end, UNFPA is striving to continue to broaden the funding base from members of the Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development (OECD)/Development Assistance Committee (DAC) and non-DAC members and to reach out to the private sector.

8. The income overview in table 1 is supplemented by annex 1, which provides detailed information on UNFPA 2006 provisional income as of 31 December 2006, actual pledges and the best estimates of contributions to UNFPA regular resources, and a list of donors for the years 2007 and future years as of 1 March 2007. These commitments include the following: (a) pledges for 2007 only and multi-year pledges for 2007 and future years; (b) pledges for 2007 received during the United Nations Pledging Conference for 2007, held on 11 November 2006; and (c) letters received and verbal indications from governments pledging support to UNFPA for the period 2007 to 2011.

9. UNFPA increased its donor base to 180 donor governments in 2006 from 172 in 2005. Multi-year pledges have also increased to 77 in 2006 from 55 in 2005. Of the total of 180 donor governments, 13 countries belonging to DAC and 13 programme countries have increased their contributions in national currency terms from the 2005 level, and 11 programme countries had increased contributions in US dollar terms. As evidence of the broad support that UNFPA has enjoyed over the past few years and the continuing growth of its funding base, it is worth noting that UNFPA received pledges in 2006 from all countries in sub-Saharan Africa and Latin America and the Caribbean. As of 1 March 2007, 111 official pledges had been received for this year. Last year, only 102 pledges had been received by this time. Details of the timing of pledges are shown in annex 2.

10. In 2006, the Netherlands, Sweden, Norway, United Kingdom and Japan were the five largest donors to UNFPA regular resources in US dollar terms (annex 1). The substantial increase in the 2006 regular income level to \$389.3 million was due to larger contributions from 11 major donors and private donations. Table 2 lists major donor countries that increased their contributions in 2006 in national currency terms compared with 2005.

11. Further details on contributions from the Fund's top 10 major donors to regular resources for the past six years are shown in annex 3.

12. As of 31 December 2006, out of the 180 donors to UNFPA regular resources, 18 major donors provided about 91.3 per cent of the total regular resources contributed to UNFPA. The percentage breakdown in US dollar terms is: Netherlands (19.3 per cent), Sweden (14.2 per cent), Norway (10.5 per cent), United Kingdom (9.7 per cent), Japan (8.6 per cent), Denmark (8.0 per cent), Germany (5.0 per cent), Finland (4.4 per cent), Canada (3.3 per cent), Switzerland (2.6 per cent), Belgium (1.0 per cent), Ireland (1.0 per cent), Spain (1.0 per cent), New Zealand (0.7 per cent), Australia (0.7 per cent), France (0.6 per cent), Luxembourg (0.4 per cent) and Italy (0.3 per cent). The remaining 162 donors, private contributions, interest income and other income accounted for approximately 8.7 per cent of the total regular resources.

13. In view of informal indications from major donors to UNFPA and some multi-year pledges already recorded, there will be increases in the US dollar equivalent for 2007, using the United Nations operational rate of exchange effective 1 March 2007. Early indications of increases in national currency terms from the 2006 contribution level were received from the countries listed in table 3.

B. Co-financing contributions

15. Over the last decade, other resources in the form of earmarked contributions to UNFPA-supported projects and programmes, also referred to as co-financing resources, have increased steadily in absolute terms. However, in the last few years, the proportion of co-financing income of the total regular and co-financing resources has remained stable, at about 30 per cent.

Co-financing from governments

16. In 2006, co-financing from programme country governments continued to form a solid part of total co-financing income. In 2006, \$25.5 million was received, compared with \$24.2 million in 2005. The 2006 contributions were from Algeria, Botswana, Brazil, Cameroon, Chile, Colombia, Dominican Republic, Egypt, Georgia, Guatemala, Kazakhstan, Lebanon, Liberia, Malaysia, Mexico, Morocco, Nigeria, Paraguay, Peru, Qatar, Sao Tome and Principe, Syrian Arab Republic, Tunisia, Uruguay and Venezuela. The five largest contributions in 2006 were received from Peru (\$14.4 million), Venezuela (\$2.0 million), Morocco (\$1.3 million), Colombia (\$1.1 million) and Mexico (\$1.1 million). The five largest contributions in 2005 were received from the following programme countries: Peru (\$19.8 million), Syrian Arab Republic (\$0.8 million), Nigeria (\$0.7 million), Guatemala (\$0.7 million) and Lebanon (\$0.4 million). Details on the co-financing contributions from these programme countries in support of their own country programmes are presented in annex 5 of this report.

17. As of 31 December 2006, co-financing income was \$167.2 million, compared with the 2005 level of \$157.7 million. With reference to co-financing, the top 10 major donors for 2005 and 2006 are listed in table 5. Details on the complete list of donors to co-financing arrangements for 2005 are presented in annex 6.

European Commission

18. In 2006, the largest amount of co-financing contributions from an intergovernmental organization was received from the European Commission, totalling \$39 million. This included \$2.5 million from the European Commission's Directorate-General for Humanitarian Aid (ECHO).

19. Last year, UNFPA signed 12 contribution agreements with the European Commission (eight for development activities with EuropeAid, one with the Central Finance and Contracts Unit in Turkey, and three with ECHO for humanitarian response), totalling euro 50.3 million (\$60 million). This amount included euro 19.6 million (\$23.7 million) committed by the European Development Fund. New agreements that were signed included grants for support to the Zambia Demographic and Health Survey 2006 and the census in Afghanistan, as well as support towards promoting gender equality by combating domestic violence against women in Turkey, reducing the vulnerability of women and girls to HIV infection in Zimbabwe and establishing a system of comprehensive social services for young people in Ukraine.

20. In the context of linking relief, rehabilitation and development efforts, the European Commission supported national training of nurse anaesthetists in Sierra Leone. New grant agreements were signed with ECHO for continued support of UNFPA activities in the Darfur region of Sudan and for delivering mobile reproductive health outreach services to conflict-affected populations in Nepal.

C. Thematic funding

21. In 2006, two thematic funds were in operation and raised significant levels of funding for the Campaign to End Fistula and the reproductive health commodity security programme.

Campaign to End Fistula

22. In 2003, UNFPA spearheaded the global Campaign to End Fistula, a collaborative initiative to prevent fistula and restore the health and dignity of those living with its consequences. The Campaign to End Fistula has been successful in raising the visibility of the broader issue of maternal health and in attracting a wide range of donors. To date, the campaign has mobilized \$16 million. In 2006, Spain was a new donor, and in 2007, new donors include Norway, Republic of Korea and AGFUND, the non-profit regional development institution established by the Arab Gulf States. Additionally, private-sector donors, including Virgin Unite and Johnson and Johnson, continued their support of the campaign in 2006, through in-kind and financial commitments to more than 40 governments. UNFPA intends to expand these partnerships in 2007. Individuals were also drawn to the thematic programme approach: the One by One project, a grass-roots initiative based in Seattle, Washington, USA, in partnership with the United Nations Foundation, raised more than \$150,000 in 2006 for the campaign; the full amount will be received by UNFPA in 2007.

23. Co-financing contributions received for the Campaign to End Fistula amounted to \$5.2 million in 2006 and \$4.8 million in 2005. Table 6 lists the 2005 and 2006 donors in descending order.

Thematic trust fund on reproductive health commodity security and the global programme to enhance reproductive health commodity security

24. Co-financing contributions received for the thematic trust fund on reproductive health commodity security and the global programme to enhance reproductive health commodity security amounted to \$14.0 million in 2006 and \$25.4 million in 2005. The 2005 and 2006 donors are listed in descending order in table 7.

25. The thematic trust fund and the global programme can be described as phase I and phase II, respectively, of recent UNFPA efforts on reproductive health commodity security. Although the trust fund and the global programme co-existed for some time while UNFPA raised funds for the global programme, the two are completely separate funds. The thematic trust fund was established in 2004 to address emergency reproductive health commodity stock-out situations at the country level. Like most past efforts on reproductive health commodity security, the thematic trust fund focused on the supply side, with 90 per cent of funds allocated for the provision of reproductive health commodities and the remainder for capacity and systems enhancement. The global programme focuses more on sustained development, with approximately 60 per cent of funds for reproductive health commodity provision and approximately 40 per cent for capacity and systems enhancement.

D. Private sector

26. The total amount of co-financing contributions received from the private sector during 2006 was \$894,256. Of this amount, \$201,277 was contributed by Americans for UNFPA (formerly known as the U.S. Committee for UNFPA), a charitable organization that raises funds from foundations and individuals to support UNFPA work. Also, UNFPA was the direct recipient of donations from private corporations (\$274,226), foundations (\$385,849) and individuals (\$32,904). The contribution of the United Nations Foundation/Hewlett Foundation in the amount of \$1 million for advocacy activities in 2006 was channelled through the United Nations Fund for International Partnerships (UNFIP).

E. UNFPA as a United Nations partner in response to humanitarian crises:
UNFPA consolidated appeal process and flash appeals for 2006

27. In 2006, UNFPA provided support for emergencies/humanitarian crises in 45 countries and territories: Botswana, Burundi, Chad, Colombia, Côte d'Ivoire, Democratic Republic of the Congo, Dominican Republic, Ethiopia, Fiji, Georgia, Guatemala, Haiti, Honduras, Indonesia, Islamic Republic of Iran, Jamaica, Kenya, Kyrgyzstan, Lebanon, Liberia, Lesotho, Malawi, Mozambique, Namibia, Nepal, Niger, Occupied Palestinian Territory, Pakistan, Philippines, Rwanda, Senegal, Sierra Leone, Somalia, Sri Lanka, Syrian Arab Republic, South Africa, Sudan, Tajikistan, Timor-Leste, Togo, Uganda, United Republic of Tanzania, Uzbekistan, Zambia and Zimbabwe.

28. With the increasing demands placed on UNFPA and its partners to respond to events and situations not provided for in regular country programming, an increasing proportion of financing for humanitarian and recovery activity is coming from other sources. Co-financing contributions for such activities – including \$16.7 million raised through the consolidated appeals process and flash appeals – amounted to more than \$43 million in 2006. The countries receiving the largest share of these resources, in descending order, were Sudan, Democratic Republic of the Congo, Pakistan (for continued response to the 2005 earthquake), Uganda, Haiti and Lebanon. In 2006, the United Nations central emergency response fund allocated \$1.7 million for UNFPA country-level activities. UNFPA received \$7.1 million from OCHA. Other pooled fund allocations totalled nearly \$3.8 million.

Conclusion

29. UNFPA values its close collaboration with the 180 donors contributing to the Fund and appreciates their commitment and generous support. It is in this spirit that UNFPA appeals to the members of the Executive Board and all members of the Fund's donor family to consider increasing their contributions for 2007 and future years to the highest level that their circumstances will permit. A more predictable cash flow is also important for good management of UNFPA operations. Therefore, UNFPA appeals to all donor governments, particularly the major donors for the timely submission of their pledges and payment schedules.

30. Annex 7 shows the growth of regular contributions based on local currencies received from the major donors for the period 2004 to 2007. The growth reflects the continuing support of the donors as well as their confidence in UNFPA. Nevertheless, the upward trend in regular resources remains vulnerable to exchange rate fluctuations.

31. The per capita contribution to UNFPA regular resources from the Fund's top 18 major donors, i.e., those contributing \$1 million or more for 2005 and 2006, is summarized in annex 8. It shows that Luxembourg has the highest per capita share of contributions to UNFPA regular and co-financing resources, followed by Norway and Sweden. In 2005, these three countries held the same rank.

32. It is essential that UNFPA continue to focus the bulk of its resource mobilization efforts on increasing regular resources. Although obtaining increases in co-financing resources is important, the ability of UNFPA to mobilize such resources depends on the existence of a stable and secure multilateral funding base. Regular resources remain the bedrock of the Fund's operations. UNFPA is steadfast in its belief that its resource mobilization philosophy and long-term strategy should be built on a strong foundation of regular resources supplemented by various combinations of co-financing funding. This is critical to enable UNFPA to support countries in implementing the ICPD Programme of Action and

achieving the MDGs. It is also essential for maintaining the universality, neutrality and multilateralism that characterize UNFPA efforts.

33. It is encouraging that UNFPA resources are increasing and that the number of major donors is also increasing. However, it is important to put this increase into perspective. In 1995, after the ICPD, regular resources amounted to \$312 million. In 2006, the amount was \$389.3 million. Given the worldwide reproductive health needs that must be addressed to achieve universal access by 2015, the increase in regular resources has been relatively modest. Fortunately, official development assistance levels are rising and it is to be hoped that this will be translated into increased contributions to UNFPA, so that the Fund can help address the increased needs of programme countries.

Elements for a decision

34. The Executive Board may wish to:

(a) **Take note of the present report (DP/FPA/2007/8) and welcome the substantial increase in the 2006 regular income level, as well as the increase in 2006 co-financing income, resulting, inter alia, from increased contributions from a number of donors, and also welcome the contributions made by programme countries, which have enabled UNFPA to reach its highest ever number of donors;**

(b) **Emphasize that regular resources are the bedrock of UNFPA and essential to maintaining the multilateral, neutral and universal nature of its work, and encourage UNFPA to further mobilize these resources while also continuing to mobilize supplementary resources for its programmes;**

(c) **Recognize that sustaining and improving the UNFPA funding level will require countries that are in a position to do so to augment their funding efforts during the period of the new UNFPA strategic plan, 2008-2011;**

(d) **Encourage all countries that are in a position to do so to make contributions early in the year and to make multi-year pledges;**

(e) **Emphasize that UNFPA needs strong political and increased financial support as well as increased and predictable core funding in order to enhance its assistance to countries to fully integrate the ICPD agenda into national development strategies and frameworks.**

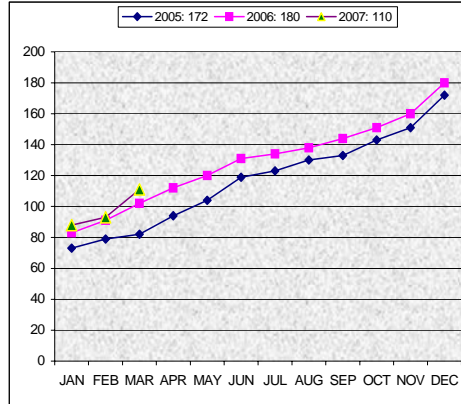
