**Note by the Executive Director**

*Summary*

The present note contains information on the first one-year extension of the UNFPA country programme for Venezuela (Bolivarian Republic of).

In accordance with established procedures, the Executive Director approves the first one-year extension of a country programme, while requests for extensions for a second year or requests for two-year extensions are submitted to the Executive Board for approval.

The country held presidential elections in December 2006. The ministerial cabinet recently presented the new national development plan (2008-2013) to the National Assembly, which will approve the plan. National authorities have expressed their interest in contributing to the United Nations Development Assistance Framework (UNDAF) process and have requested that the UNDAF be aligned to the government planning cycle. The new UNDAF and the corresponding country programmes (2009-2013) of the UNDG Executive Committee agencies will therefore be aligned with the government cycle and with national development priorities.	The current country programme and the 2006 midterm review report provide an adequate framework for the UNFPA-supported programme in Venezuela. The programme may easily be extended for an additional year.
