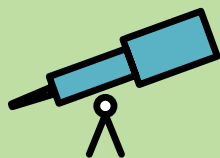

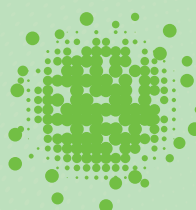

DECENTRALIZED evaluations managed by country and regional offices, and other HQ organizational units

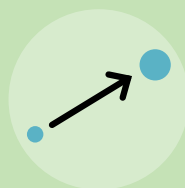
Presents clear roles and responsibilities for the evaluation function

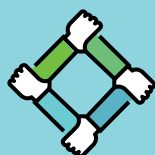
