




A first-of-its-kind evaluation in the United Nations system

Formative evaluation of the UNFPA engagement in the reform of the United Nations development system presented to the Executive Board



On 2 February 2023, the <u>formative evaluation of the UNFPA engagement in the reform</u> <u>of the United Nations development system</u> and its management response were presented at the Executive Board First Regular Session 2023.





A joint statement by 25 Member States (Australia, Austria, Belgium, Canada, Denmark, Finland, France, Georgia, Germany, Iceland, Ireland, Italy, Japan, Luxembourg, the Kingdom of the Netherlands, New Zealand, Norway, Republic of Moldova, Spain, Sweden, Switzerland, Türkiye, the United Kingdom, Ukraine, and the United States of America) welcomed the evaluation and commended UNFPA for conducting a first-ofits-kind exercise in the United Nations system.



The Member States emphasized that the UNFPA mandate can only be fulfilled by working with others in the United Nations family. In this regard, they welcomed the clear areas for actions identified by the management based on the evaluation recommendations. This includes the development of an overall engagement strategy with the reform; institutionalising and internalising the reform, addressing human resource challenges, and ensuring that those working in humanitarian contexts make the best use of the reform. The Member States noted that these steps are necessary for the reform to bring about long-term changes and meaningful impact. The joint statement also encouraged other United Nations entities to follow the trailblazer role of UNFPA to evaluate their respective engagements in the reform.

In addition, Canada, Colombia, the Republic of Moldova and Switzerland also commended the evaluation for its valuable insights and for generating recommendations for UNFPA to more effectively contribute to the implementation of the reform and benefit from its results.


From the Director's desk


The evaluation finds that UNFPA has provided a **significant contribution** to the repositioning of the United Nations development system, which has helped to **advance the repositioning process**. UNFPA has leveraged the reform to **deliver better to the stakeholders** and **the people it serves**. At the same time, **costs and risks** resulting from UNFPA engagement in the reform need to be reduced and managed.

Quick facts



The evaluation recommends UNFPA provide stronger strategic direction for its engagement with the reform, while better institutionalising and internalising the reform at all levels of the organization. UNFPA should also ensure humanitarian staff work better with partners across the development-humanitarian-peace nexus, making the best use of the reform.

Given the depth and complexity of global crises facing the world and the pushback on the achievement of Sustainable Development Goals, accelerating the reform measures **focusing on coordination** and **joint and system-wide efforts** is paramount. In this regard, I hope the evidence and lessons from this timely evaluation will help UNFPA to more effectively contribute to the reform while enhancing its ability to deliver for those furthest behind.
