Key achievements

I. Midwifery Area:

- 51 midwives were trained with ICM standards in 2016, with the aim of improving midwifery practices with to reduce maternal and neonatal mortality
- A qualified team of 20 midwifery professors at the National School of Health (faculty members / corpo docente) has been formed;
- The 52 women's men received extracurricular training in "humanistic and ethical in providing quality health care".
- The workability of the Bissau-Guinean Association of Midwives and Obstetrics Infi (AGUIPEO) has been strengthened through the acquisition of the following: 1 computer, 1 laptop, 1 printer, 1 photocopier, 1 digital camera and 1 external hard drive, 2 tables, 4 chairs.

- 142 communities reported abandonment of FGM/Early Marriage/School Abandonment and other harmful practices;
- 91 CSO/NGO actors have been able to prevent/protect and care for women and girls who are victims in the FGM/VBG/HIV/SRAJ theme;
- 35,000 people were involved in community mobilization for behavioural change in favour of women's empowerment and the community free of harm

- 35 Religious and traditional leaders renewed their compromises for the abandonment of FGM and other harmful practices and in community mobilization increasing the demand for SSR/PF services;
- Men's clubs have conducted awareness and information sharing activities on gender-based violence (VBG) and FGM/C. : 12,000 people (5,000 women, young people and 200 traditional and religious leaders, ability by men's clubs to abandon FGM/VBG/ and other harmful practices including the involvement of women in changing social norms and gender;
- A 'socio-cultural and anthropological study on female genital mutilation' has been carried out and published;
- 100 health care providers and midwives have been trained in the implementation of the SGBV/FGM case management protocol in the five regions of the country (Quinara, Oio and Farim);

- The SSR dimension has been integrated into the 2nd and 3rd cycle of schooling.

Contributions de l'UNFPA

- UNFPA contributed financially to the MICS 6 survey, which revealed that the birth rate of 15-19 year olds per 1000 women is 84%, so 27% of girls aged 20-24 have had a pregnancy before reaching 18 years.
