**Extensions of country programmes**

*Summary*

The present note contains information on the extensions of UNFPA country programmes. First-time extensions of country programmes up to one year are approved by the Executive Director and presented to the Executive Board for information. All other requests for extensions of country programmes are submitted to the Executive Board for approval.

The Executive Board may wish to take note of the first-time one-year extensions of the country programmes for the Central African Republic, Chad, Democratic People's Republic of Korea, Gambia, Iran, Mongolia, Morocco, Niger, Sao Tome and Principe, South Sudan and Sudan, as presented in table 1, and approve the second one-year extensions of the country programmes for Lebanon, Libya, Tajikistan and Zambia, as presented in table 2
