### Extensions of country programmes

#### *Summary*

The present note contains information on the extensions of UNFPA country programmes. First-time extensions of country programmes up to one year are approved by the Executive Director, and presented to the Executive Board for information. All other requests for extensions of country programmes are submitted to the Executive Board for approval.

The Executive Board may wish to approve the third, three-month extension of the country programme for Madagascar and the fifth, six-month extension of the country programme for the Syrian Arab Republic, as presented in table 1.

The Government of Madagascar and the United Nations country team (UNCT) agreed to finalize the United Nations Sustainable Development Cooperation Framework (UNSDCF) by June 2021. Accordingly, the UNFPA country programme is to be extended for three months to enable completion of the UNSDCF and appropriate sequencing—in alignment with UNDP and UNICEF.	During the three-month extension period, UNFPA will continue to focus on the priorities and results identified within the current country programme cycle.

The country programme will continue to focus on improving access to high-quality reproductive health care; scaling-up gender-based violence prevention and response; supporting capacities to collect and use gender and age-disaggregated data for the response and recovery programming; engage with young people to foster social cohesion and reconciliation; and improve the well-being of the most vulnerable populations.
