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# United Nations Population Fund Statistical and financial review, 2014 Report of the Executive Director

#### Summary

In 2014, total UNFPA revenue was \$1,025.1 million, including \$523.3 million in regular resources. In 2014, total revenue increased by \$48.4 million (5.0 per cent), which was attributable to an increase in regular resource and other resource revenue of \$27.7 and \$20.7 million, respectively. Gross regular resource contribution revenue increased by \$17.4 million, or 3.8 per cent, from 2013 to 2014.

Increased and predictable regular resources are necessary to enable UNFPA to implement its strategic plan and deliver its programmes to help countries ensure individual well-being, resilience and sustained economic growth, while protecting the environment for present and future generations, in the context of the International Conference on Population and Development (ICPD) beyond 2014, and the transformational post-2015 development agenda. Adequate resources would enable UNFPA to support governments and civil society to engage fully in the implementation of the recommendations of the ICPD follow-up beyond 2014 review and in follow-up to the post-2015 development agenda outcomes. Universal access to sexual and reproductive health and reproductive rights; investments in and promotion of the rights of young people, including adolescent girls; the human rights of women and girls; and the unfinished agenda of maternal health as well as strengthening countries' capacity to collect, analyse and use data for planning and monitoring are all central to the achievement of the transformational development agenda. With respect to the funding base, UNFPA will continue to focus on increasing and achieving greater stability and predictability in contributions to regular resources, which are the foundation and bedrock of the Fund's operations.

Total UNFPA expenses in 2014 amounted to \$995.6 million.

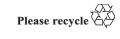
The balance of unexpended regular resources at the end of 2014 available for reprogramming was \$25.1 million (\$6.1 million in 2013). This amount represents the 5.3 per cent of the regular resource contribution revenue of \$477.4 million and is available for programming in 2015. UNFPA increased its operational reserve to \$95.1 million in accordance with its applicable financial regulations and rules.

The figures in this review are consistent with the full accrual basis of accounting and are in compliance with International Public Sector Accounting Standards, with the exception of table 15, which presents resource utilization in the integrated resource plan, 2014-2017, on a budgetary comparable basis. All data in the document is provisional, subject to external audit.

UNFPA closed the year 2014 in robust financial health.

A recommendation for the Board's consideration is contained in section VI of the present document.







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#### I. Introduction

- 1. The statistical and financial review, 2014, provides summary information on UNFPA revenue and expenses for the year, and on assets, liabilities and fund balances, as at 31 December 2014. This information is provided for activities funded by both regular and other resources. All figures in the present document are provisional, subject to external audit and, as a result of rounding out, may not add up to the totals.
- 2. The statements of "revenue and expenses for the year ended 31 December 2014" are provided in annex 1, table 1, for regular, other and total resources, and in annex 1, table 2, for other resources by category. The statement of "assets, liabilities and fund balances as at 31 December 2014" is provided in annex 1, table 3, for total resources. The statement of changes in net assets for the year ended 31 December 2014 is provided in annex 1, table 4.
- 3. The 2014 figures are presented consistent with the full accrual basis of accounting and are in compliance with International Public Sector Accounting Standards, with the exception of table 15, which presents resource utilization in the integrated resource plan on a budgetary comparable basis (modified accrual basis).
- 4. Throughout the report reference is made to other resource contributions as 'gross' or 'net'. Gross contributions include amounts specified in agreements signed with donors and recognized as revenue consistent with UNFPA accounting policies, regardless of the period of implementation and the payment schedule. Net contributions are exclusive of cost recoveries related to activities implemented in 2014 and refunds to donors within the year.

#### II. Total resources

#### A. Revenue

- 5. Total revenue to UNFPA in 2014 was \$1,025.1 million; this represented a \$48.4 million (5.0 per cent) increase over 2013 levels (\$976.7 million). The total gross contribution revenue was \$1,006.6 million.
- 6. Total gross contribution revenue for the last five years can be summarized as follows:

7. Contributions to regular resources increased by \$17.4 million (3.8 per cent) from 2013 levels. Contributions to other resources increased over the same period by \$24.9 million (4.9 per cent), thereby increasing the share of other resources, as a percentage of total contributions, from 52.3 per cent in 2013 to 52.6 per cent in 2014. This increase has reinstated the pattern of continuous growth of other resources as a percentage of total contributions, which was observed for a number of years and interrupted in 2013 when contributions to other resources decreased in both absolute values and as a share of total resources.

#### B. Expenses

8. Total expenses in 2014 were \$995.6 million. The breakdown of total expenses in 2014 can be summarized as follows:

- 10. The strategic plan, 2014-2017, and its business model introduced a new classification of countries whereby all countries/territories where UNFPA operates were categorized into four quadrants: red, orange, yellow and pink based on a combination of factors such as need, ability to finance, and population. The list of all countries and their new classification is included in the annex 2.

- 12. Programme and institutional budget expenses are further detailed in annex 1, tables 5 to 12.
- 13. In 2014, UNFPA spent \$820.2 million on country programmes, global and regional interventions, and other programme activities. Governments and non-governmental organizations implemented 31.1 per cent (\$255.1 million) of these expenses, compared with 28.7 per cent (\$215.7 million) in 2013. In addition, 48.6 per cent of UNFPA programme activities (\$398.3 million) in 2014 either had gender equality/women's empowerment as their primary objective or made a significant contribution to gender equality.
- 14. The breakdown of programme expenses by country/territory, region and quadrant for regular and other resources is provided in annex 1, table 13.
- 15. In 2014, \$143.7 million was spent from regular resources on the least developed countries. This represents 51.8 per cent of the total regular resource expenses of \$277.6 million for country programmes.
- 16. A total of \$118.9 million of regular resources was spent on programme activities in low-income economies, which represents 42.8 per cent of total regular resource expenses for country programmes in 2014. The breakdown of expenses in least developed countries and low-income economies is provided in annex 1, table 14.

#### C. Fund balances and reserves

17. Reserves and fund balances at 31 December 2014 totalled \$733.9 million. Reserves and fund balances for 2014 can be summarized as follows:

#### D. Integrated budget

- 18. In its decision 2013/32, the Executive Board approved the first UNFPA integrated budget, 2014-2017 (DP/FPA/2013/14), aligned with the strategic plan for the same period. The integrated budget encompasses all cost categories and results of the organization within a single, integrated framework.
- 19. Annex 1, tables 5 to 12, presents information on the expenses (on accrual basis of accounting) for the year ended 2014 by four development outcomes (with further details by output) and three organizational efficiency and effectiveness outputs in the strategic plan and integrated budget.
- 20. Annex 1, table 15, presents information on the actual utilization of resources for the year ended 2014 against the estimates included in the integrated resource plan of the integrated budget. Resource utilization is presented under the modified accrual basis of accounting, consistent with the budget presentation.
- 21. Annex 1, table 16, provides further details of the institutional budget component of the integrated budget by expense categories.

#### III. Regular resources

#### A. Revenue and expenses

- 22. Compared with 2013, the total revenue of regular resources in 2014 increased by \$27.7 million (5.6 per cent), from \$495.6 million to \$523.3 million.
- 23. At 31 December 2014, UNFPA made a provision for doubtful accounts of \$0.3 million (same as in 2013) for contributions receivable and operating fund advances with implementing partners for which collection was considered doubtful.
- 24. Annex 1, table 17, provides a summary of regular resource contributions in excess of \$1.0 million.
- 25. Actual programme expenses for the year were \$339.2 million.
- 26. In annex 1, tables 5 to 12 delineate programme expenses funded from regular resources.

#### **B.** Fund balances and reserves

- 27. The balance of unexpended regular resources at the end of 2014 available for programming in 2015 was \$25.1 million, as illustrated in annex 1, table 18. This amount is 5.3 per cent of 2014 regular resource contribution revenue.
- 28. At 31 December 2014, UNFPA had increased the operational reserve to \$95.1 million. This amount equals 20.0 per cent of the year's net regular resource contributions revenue, in accordance with UNFPA financial regulations and rules.

#### IV. Other resources

#### A. Revenue and expenses

- 29. In UNFPA, other resources comprise trust funds, other funds, the junior professional officers programme, and procurement services non-third party services related (hereinafter, referred to as procurement services). In 2014, gross contributions to other resources were equal to \$529.2 million; if calculated on a net basis, excluding \$3.7 million of refunds to donors and \$33.8 million of cost recoveries, contributions to other resources amounted to \$491.7 million.
- 30. The total gross revenue to other resources during 2014 was \$539.2 million, or \$501.7 million if calculated on a net basis. Compared to 2013, other resources revenue has increased by \$24.5 million on a gross basis and \$20.7 million on a net basis.

#### **B.** Fund balances

33. The excess of revenue over expenses (surplus) for 2014 under other resources was \$6.5 million, as shown in annex 1, table 1.

#### C. Cost recovery

34. UNFPA charges cost recovery for the implementation of projects funded with other resources. The latest cost recovery rates were approved by the Executive Board in its decision 2013/9, and range from 5 per cent for contributions from programme governments contributing to their own country programmes to 8 per cent for standard co-financing agreements. In 2014, exceptions to the standard rates were granted to the following donors: the Secretariat of the Pacific Community (7 per cent), the UNDP Multi-Partner Trust Fund (6.25 per cent), and the United Nations Office for the Coordination of Humanitarian Affairs (5 per cent).

#### V. Cash and investments

35. At 31 December 2014, cash and investments held by UNFPA totalled \$934.8 million (\$766.5 million in 2013), made up of cash and cash equivalents (which include investments with a duration of less than 90 days) of \$59.4 million and other investments of \$875.4 million. Cash, cash equivalents and investments are shown in annex 1, table 3.

#### VI. Recommendation

- 36. The Executive Board may wish to:
- (a) Take note of the present report DP/FPA/2015/5/(Part I)/Add.1;
- (b) *Recognize* the significance of increasing and achieving stability and predictability in contributions to UNFPA regular resources, as these are the foundation and bedrock of the Fund's operations;
- (c) Recognize also that timeliness in the payment of contributions is essential to maintaining liquidity and facilitating continuous programme implementation to help countries ensure individual well-being, resilience and sustained economic growth, while protecting the environment for present and future generations, in the context of the International Conference on Population and Development (ICPD) beyond 2014, and the transformational post-2015 development agenda.
