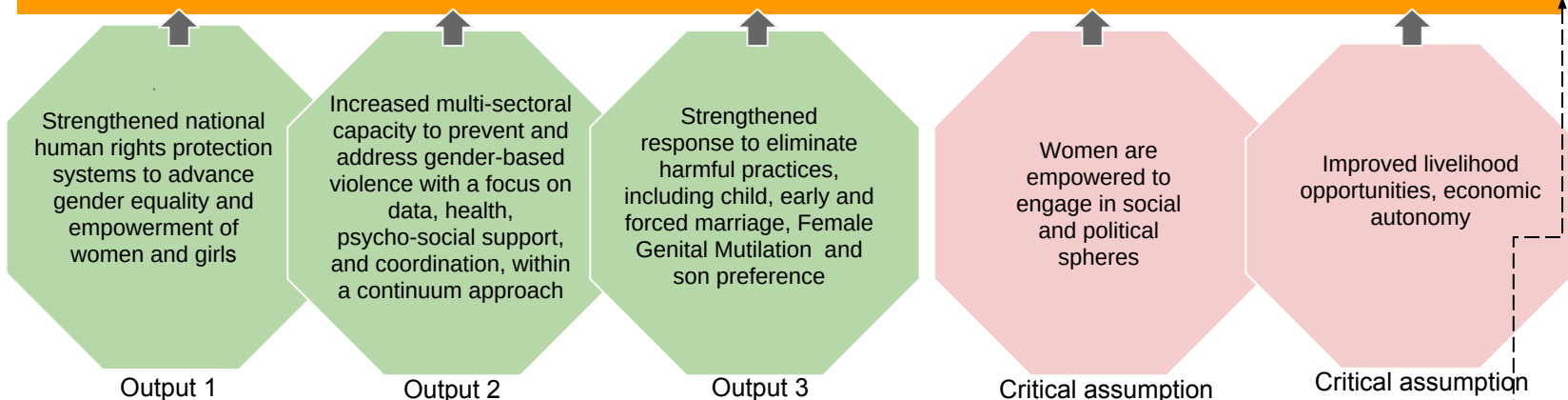

Advanced gender equality and the empowerment of all women and girls, exercising reproductive rights, with a specific focus on the most marginalized and disadvantaged populations



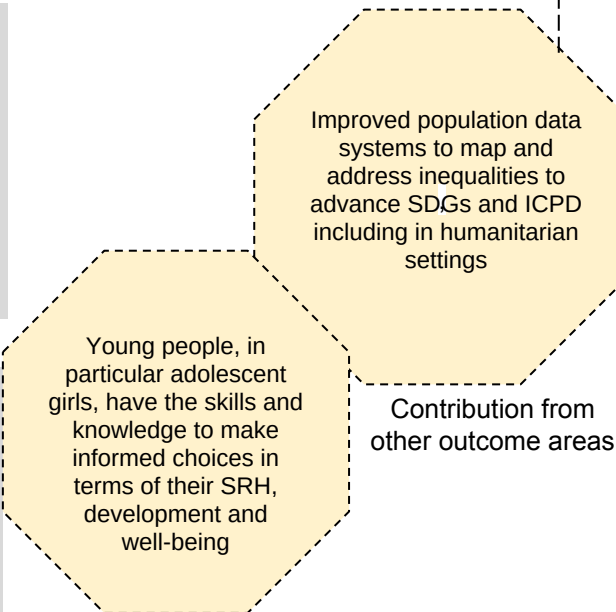
- Advocacy**
- ❑ Integrate gender equality and reproductive rights, including life free of violence, into legal and policy frameworks
  - ❑ Establish social accountability mechanisms for addressing reproductive rights, including GBV and harmful practices, of women, marginalized and key populations
  - ❑ Advocate for elimination of harmful practices
  - ❑ Facilitate mainstreaming of actions to address GBV and promote gender equality across humanitarian clusters and sectors
  - ❑ Implement existing laws and the institutionalization of policies and programs that engage with men and boys

- Capacity**
- ❑ Develop the capacities of regional and national human rights protection systems to track the implementation of reproductive rights recommendations
  - ❑ Develop comprehensive frameworks to address the most pervasive forms of violence against women and girls and other harmful practices affecting their SRH and reproductive rights
  - ❑ Develop, disseminate and implement multisectoral essential services standards on GBV (including FGM), with emphasis on the health sector response and SRH/FP services
  - ❑ Integrate GBV prevention and response actions into country-level contingency, preparedness and response plans
  - ❑ Implement a wide-reaching, multi-faceted capacity development strategy for significantly increasing the pool of available actors who can effectively address GBV in humanitarian contexts

- Knowledge**
- ❑ Support research and evidence gathering on social norms, sexual violence against girls, harmful practices and SRH
  - ❑ Significantly augment the evidence base for addressing GBV in conflict, post-conflict, disaster and recovery contexts
  - ❑ Promote UNFPA Minimum Standards for Prevention of and Response to GBV in Emergencies in preparedness, response and recovery programmes

- Services**
- ❑ Strengthen the life-saving attention to GBV in the earliest stages of humanitarian response by a wide range of humanitarian actors

- Partnership and coordination**
- ❑ Lead coordination of interagency GBV working groups in all humanitarian contexts
  - ❑ Partner with those stakeholders that lead the areas mentioned under the critical assumption and monitor the effectiveness of multisectoral approach
