
Consolidating UNFPA Funding Architecture Main Thematic Funds Needs and Gaps

Responding to UNFPA's annual global appeals, the **Humanitarian Action Thematic Fund (HTF)** will provide flexible and multi-year funding, and include activities under response, preparedness, and the humanitarian-development nexus, in three main programmatic areas: **sexual and reproductive health and rights (SRHR)**, **Gender Based Violence prevention and response**, and **humanitarian data**.

The HTF, financed by governmental and private donations, will join existing funding modalities for UNFPA's humanitarian response, namely, the Emergency Fund (EF) and the Humanitarian Response Reserve (HRR).

The HTF will provide contributions to holistically cover UNFPA's humanitarian response appeals, without further geographical, thematic or time earmarks. This will greatly reduce the transaction costs associated with individual management of agreements, reduce procurement costs, and allow UNFPA to provide pre-financed rapid response to emergencies as they happen.

The HTF presents a unique opportunity for current donors to strengthen - UNFPA's humanitarian work - as well as for new contributors, for which participating in a pooled arrangement provides the potential to achieve significant results.
