In Ukraine, the EU supports UNFPA's mobile clinics and helps survivors of gender-based violence, including sexual violence. Through the Instrument for Pre-Accession Assistance, UNFPA and its local partners challenge gender stereotypes and promote positive masculinity in EU candidate countries. In Venezuela, with EU assistance, UNFPA ensures indigenous women and girls have access to essential services. In Moldova, UNFPA and the EU support the government in organizing the national census.
