

The UN Global Funding Compact's 30% target for core resources is an ideal mix, which provides the predictability, flexibility and agility needed to deliver impactful responses on the ground.

## Core and Non-Core Contributions 2014-2023<sup>1</sup>



<sup>1</sup> In 2022, UNFPA was requested by the United Nations Board of Auditors to modify its accounting policy for revenue recognition for contributions to core resources. Because of this change, all figures for both core and non-core resources in 2023 are shown as contributions received, i.e. the amount of cash transferred to UNFPA in a given year. The figures for 2022 have been restated to also reflect contributions received to allow for comparability of data between 2022 and 2023. Data prior to 2022 remain shown as revenue figures, i.e., amounts recognized as revenue in the year in which the agreements were signed.




# TOP DONORS 2023 Global Statistics



### Number of Donor Governments That Have Committed to **UNFPA's Core Resources**




While core funding remains the gold standard, non-core resources can range in their degree of flexibility from highly flexible to tightly earmarked. Predictable and flexible non-core resources sustain and grow UNFPA's work. UNFPA's four global thematic funds - the Supplies Partnership, the Maternal and Newborn Health, Humanitarian and Population Data Thematic Funds are closely linked to UNFPA's three transformative results and only lightly earmarked. UNFPA encourages all Member States to prioritize these quality funding instruments when allocating non-core resources.


### Contributions over US\$1.0 million to Global Thematic Funds




